

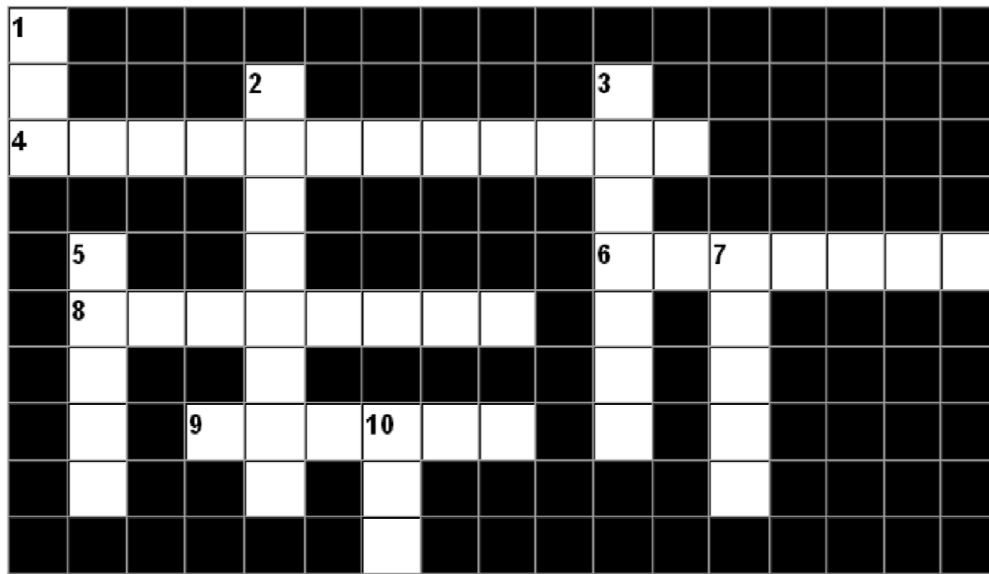


Halloween
